TAX TALK

IRS Warning about Employee Retention Credit Claims

For the past many month, media advertising as well as numerous emails have been sent, and phone messages left to businesses all over the country, including those in Annandale. The IRS warns of progressive promoters making offers too good to be true. In a further warning to businesses, the Internal Revenue Service has added these widely circulating promoter claims involving Employee Retention Credits to the annual Dirty Dozen list of tax scams.

The IRS spotlighted Employee Retention Credits as blatant attempts by promoters to con ineligible people to claim the credit. Renewing several earlier alerts, the IRS has highlighted schemes from promoters who have been blasting ads on radio and the internet touting refunds involving Employee Retention Credits, also known as ERCs. These promotions can be based on inaccurate information related to eligibility for and computation of the credit.

"The aggressive marketing of these credits is deeply troubling and a major concern for the IRS," said IRS Commissioner Danny Werfel. "Businesses need to think twice before filing a claim for these credits. While the credit has provided a financial lifeline to millions of businesses, there are promoters misleading people and businesses into thinking they can claim these credits. There are very specific guidelines around these pandemic-era credits; they are not available to just anyone. The IRS urges honest taxpayers not to be caught up in these schemes."

Abusive ERC promotions highlight day one of the IRS annual Dirty Dozen campaign – a list of 12 scams and schemes that put taxpayers and the tax professional community at risk of losing money, personal information, data and more.

Beware of ERC promotions

While many eligible employers claimed and have already received the ERC, some third



parties continue to widely advertise their services targeting taxpayers who may not be eligible for the ERC. Unfortunately, these advertisements, along with the increased prevalence of websites touting how easy it is to qualify for the ERC, lend an air of legitimacy to abusive claims for refund.

Third party promoters of the ERC often don't accurately explain eligibility for and computation of the credit. They may make broad arguments suggesting that all employers are eligible without evaluating an employer's individual circumstances. For example, only recovery startup businesses are eligible for the ERC in the fourth quarter of 2021, but these third-party promoters fail to explain this limitation. In addition, some third parties do not inform employers that they cannot claim the ERC on wages that were reported as payroll costs in obtaining Paycheck Protection Program loan forgiveness. Additionally, some of these advertisements exist solely to collect the taxpayer's personally identifiable information in exchange for false promises. The scammers then use the information to conduct identity theft.

The IRS reminds all taxpayers that the willful filing of false information and fraudulent tax forms can lead to serious civil and criminal penalties.



Warm Weather Brings Door to Door Solicitors



Is the salesperson at your door properly licensed? Know your rights under the federal "Cooling Off" rule and the Virginia Home Solicitation Sales Act. These laws apply to virtually all purchases made in your home or at any location that is not the seller's permanent place of business.

Peddlers and Solicitors

- Soliciting is the sale of goods or services door-to-door or from a temporary stand and is regulated by Fairfax County Code. Fairfax County requires peddlers and solicitors be licensed before they solicit door to door. They may solicit only between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m., and may not solicit at a residence which posts a "No Peddlers or Solicitors" sign.
- A peddler or solicitor must show the license upon request and must leave the premises immediately if asked to leave. Often solicitors will show customers an ID badge or some other document, claiming that they are licensed by Fairfax County when they are not.
- When a solicitor knocks. Ask for his or her license.
- If they do not have a valid license, ask them to leave.
- Close and lock your door.
- Immediately call Fairfax County Police (non-emergency) at 703-691-2131 to report the violation.
- Solicitors offer a wide variety of goods and services for sale. Solicitors may be selling goods or services such as magazine subscriptions, tree work, firewood, driveway sealing, coupon books, or meat; or "setting appointments" for high-speed internet/cable service, home improvements, or home security alarms. No matter what good or service they are offering, the solicitor is required to have a license.
- Peddler and Solicitor Licenses are issued by the Regulation and Licensing Branch of the Department of Cable and Consumer Services, 12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 127, Fairfax, Virginia 22035.
- The Fairfax County Solicitor's License is a laminated card that displays the solicitor's photograph, name, and personal information on the front side. The back side of the license displays the solicitor's business information and thumbprints. It is valid for one year from date of issue.

A Buyer's Right to Cancel

- Virginia law gives consumers the right to cancel a home solicitation contract for \$25 or more at any time prior to midnight of the third business day after the date of the transaction.
- Consumers have up to 30 days to cancel if the seller has misrepresented the nature or purpose of transaction.
- A waiver or modification of a buyer's right to cancel is void and of no effect. In the event a buyer grants such a waiver or modification, the buyer's right to cancel begins on the first business day after he learns that the waiver or modification is void and of no effect.
- Cancellation occurs when the buyer gives written notice of cancellation to the seller.
- After cancellation, the consumer must make available to the seller any goods delivered by the seller, and in as good condition as when received. If a seller fails to recover the goods within 20 days after cancellation or revocation, then the goods become the property of the buyer, with no obligation to pay for them.
- The Virginia Home Solicitation Sales Act does not apply to sales resulting from prior negotiations between the parties, or in some cases when the buyer has asked the seller to provide goods or services without delay because of an emergency.


The Seller's Obligations

- The seller must tell you about your cancellation rights at the time of sale.
- The seller must provide you with a copy of your receipt (for cash sales) or contract (for credit sales). The receipt or contract must be in the same language used in the sales presentation. The receipt or contract should be dated, show the name and address of the seller, and explain your right to cancel.
- Virginia law requires that the **Buyer's Right to Cancel** must appear as a conspicuous caption on the front side of the receipt or contract, or immediately above the buyer's signature, in bold face type with a minimum size of 10 points.
- Under federal law, the seller must give you two copies of a cancellation form: one to keep and one to send.
- After you cancel within permitted time-frames, the seller has 10 days to:
- Refund your money.
- Cancel and return any promissory note or other negotiable instrument you signed.
- Return any trade-in you gave, and return it in as good condition as when received by the seller.
- If the seller fails to return the trade-in, you may recover its equivalent monetary value as stated in the agreement.
- After cancellation, a seller who provided goods has 10 days to inform the buyer whether the goods will be picked up.
- A seller who does not recover the goods within 20 days of cancellation forfeits ownership of them.
- The seller is not entitled to compensation for services performed prior to the end of the cancellation period.

A violation of any provision of the Virginia Home Solicitation Sales Act is subject to any and all of the enforcement provisions under the Virginia Consumer Protection Act.

Sports Physicals Offered

How to prepare for a physical?

Prior to the sports physical:

- Check with your child's school or sports league to obtain the required forms to bring with you during your visit
- Fill out the parent and student sections of the forms.
- Bring a list of prescription drugs your child is currently taking.

What to expect during a physical

The following is a general guide of what you can expect during the sports physical:

Discussion of Medical History

- Family history of serious illness
- Past and present illnesses
- Allergies
- Previous surgeries and/or hospitalizations
- Past injuries
 Past and present prescription drugs

Physical Exam

- Measuring height and weight
- Checking pulse and blood pressure
- Eye test
- Evaluation the condition of the heart, lungs and throat
- Checking strength and flexibility of the extremities

Neurologic exam

Roof Maintenance
If I hit my house with my Car, Who Pays?

Homeowners must ensure that a roof is stable and in good working order. The condition of a roof often plays a significant factor in determining homeowners insurance rates, as insurers are often hesitant to cover homes with old and damaged roofs. Maintaining your roof and replacing it if it does not function properly is necessary for helping keep homes safe, protected and insurable.

Being Proactive

Roofs might seem basic on the surface with shingles, gutters and a frame, but they are more complicated than that. Roofs need to be dry and well-ventilated. However, they can trap heat and moisture, often leading to mold, which can be dangerous and create significant issues in homes. Additionally, shingles can trap water, which can cause rot and structural damage.

Hire a professional to inspect your roof before mold or structural damage occurs because once it does, the entire house may be at risk. Conducting routine maintenance and ensuring proper ventilation can help limit potential home damage.

Do I Need a New Roof?

Maintaining your roof can help reduce the likelihood of needing to replace it with a new one for a while. However, this requires routine inspections (especially after severe weather) and maintenance to help avoid substantial issues. A lack of regular care can lead to significant and permanent damage, which may require you to install a new roof—at considerable expense.

I Hit My House With My Car. Who Pays?

We all might miscalculate our turning radius or forget to look behind us when reversing. So, if you've mistakenly backed your car into your house, you might wonder how your insurance will help you out. When it comes to household damage, then your **homeowners insurance** will often apply. Always check your policy to determine exactly how your plan will help you out, however.

Fault in Collisions with Buildings

One day, while you are running late for work, you start to back out of the driveway. However, the car swerves and you wind up backing into a pair of French doors. That's a bad way to start your morning. But, the right insurance coverage can help you cover the costs of the damage.

The unfortunate part of building collisions is that they are often the driver's fault. Unlike times when you hit another vehicle, there is likely no dispute over who caused the problem. After all, your house could not cause the collision. Therefore, you will have to pay for the damage using your own insurance.

Your **car insurance** will often cover vehicle repairs if you have collision insurance. However, auto policies won't pay for your property damage. In this case, you might have to turn to your home insurance.

Homeowners Insurance for Car Wreck Damage

Though you caused the wreck that damaged your house, your homeowners policy will likely pay for the damage. You will have to file this damage claim separately from your claim on your car insurance.

- Policies usually include structure coverage for the portions of the house that get damaged. Structure insurance can help you pay for the necessary repairs.
- If your policy has detached structure coverage, then it will cover damage done to other buildings. So, if you accidentally back into a storage shed or carport, then your policy can pay for repairs to that item.
- Should the collision damage belongings in the house, then
 your possessions insurance can cover those costs. Some policies might only pay the item's cash value at the time of the
 accident, however.

Remember, terms and conditions will apply on your homeowners policy. It will likely include deductibles, for instance. If you have a \$1,000 structure deductible, and your house sustains \$2,500 in damage, then your policy will only pay up to \$1,500. Damage that costs less than the cost of the deductible will not have coverage.

Though you might have to file against both your homeowners and auto insurance when you back into your home, it can prove

beneficial. Give your agent a call to make sure your policies includes the appropriate coverage for such losses.

Expansion to Fare Free Services



Recently, Fairfax County approved the expansion of fare free services on all Fairfax Connector routes for children ages 12 and younger when accompanied by a paying adult. The expansion is effective beginning May 1st, 2023.

Current policy allows for up to two children, ages four and younger, to ride on Fairfax Connector routes free when accompanied by a paying adult. This expansion is in addition to other fare reduction programs which include:

- A Free Student Bus Pass for Fairfax County middle and high school students, for all connector and City of Fairfax CUE routes
- Free transfers to and from the WMATA bus rail service
- And the <u>Transit Ridership Incentive Program (TRIP)</u> half-fare discount for economically disadvantaged residents

Before these change, children five and older were still required to pay the full ride fare. This expansion of fare free services will help fill the gap in the current policy. This new policy does not place a limit on the number of children under the age of 12 who can ride for free. This is a change that supports our <u>One Fairfax</u> policy by increasing access to transit services and reducing barriers. Staff will perform a service equity analysis once the change has gone into effect, to help us understand what impacts the new policy will have. We hope to see no negative impacts on those who rely on public transportation, only positive, while introducing an entire generation to the benefit's public transportation.

Four Orange Line Stations Closures for Summer Construction

Metro has begun rail replacement work on the Orange Line. During construction, which will be done in two phases to minimize station closures, Metro will replace the original 40-year-old steel rail between Ballston-MU and Vienna stations. Replacing the track in this section is a top priority to ensure safety and increase reliability. Crews will also install fiber-optic cables during this shutdown to modernize communications and allow for more efficient maintenance in the future

Free shuttle bus service will be available for customers during all station closures. Customers are advised to plan extra time for their travel. Metro is boosting outreach to customers at the affected stations and will have prominent signage, announcements in stations and on trains, and teams of outreach personnel to assist customers with the temporary travel patterns during the construction.

Old-Growth Greatness

Many of us think of the forest when Nature comes to mind. All of our lives we lived amongst trees, be it a lone silver maple in your front yard or a tall stand of oaks in the back forty. Trees are and will remain a part of our own ecosystems.

Closer examination reveals the established woodlands we see today are second-growth forests, from 100 years or more ago. Virgin forests once covered much of the Eastern U. S. and Pacific Northwest. Sadly, only about one percent of those uncut stands remains east of the Mississippi River. What caused this? Quite simply, progressive commercial and industrial logging, and a fungal tree disease from Asia.

Settlement and expansion between the 1600s and 1700s were relatively modest. Settlors only cleared trees from a few acres to build homesteads and grow personal crops. But the growth of villages, towns and then cities fueled commercial downing of forests for timber in the 1800s. Old-growth forests that thrived for centuries, especially in the south, were replaced with softwood pine plantations.

The American chestnut dominated much of eastern U.S. among the largest, tallest, and fastest growing trees before they were slowly wiped out in the first half of the 20th century by a fungal blight, the greatest tragedy in American forest history. Back then, the forest was a dark shadowy expanse that the Lewis and Clarke expedition warily saw dissipate, once upon the Great Plains.

Uncut and less cut forests host more diverse ecosystems and biodiversity. Surveys have established finding almost 500 salamanders per acre as compared to 100 salamanders in younger woods. Many species of lichens, mushrooms, and insects are only found in old-growth timbers.

Today's old-growth forest stands have towering 100+ foot high canopies. Giant trees of different species and numerous fallen tree trunks in different stages of decomposition back are signs of virgin forests. Another clue is the presence of huge bends or unusual growth patterns in mature tree trunks, indicators of past disruptions in natural growth often caused by other trees falling on neighboring saplings and sudden shifts in nutrient light availability. Naturalists call this ability for trees to adapt by curving growth "sinuosity".

Another rapidly scientific interest re: trees, especially in old-growth areas, is the growing evidence that trees are connected by vast networks of fungal networks in and amongst tree roots. This has opened a wide series of studies about the subterranean interaction, likely chemical communications amongst trees as a community.

An amazing old-growth stands grows on the Virginia Tech campus in Blacksburg known as Stadium Woods. This rare forest consists of 11.5 acres of large to very large trees, including dozens of white oaks over 300 years old. The university considered clearing this miracle forest until significant public outcry and VA Tech's realization of its truly unique historic, educational, and research importance.

I will never forget walking through Stadium Woods with its absolutely giant, towering white oaks with massive thick trunks which significantly spread into a higher layer of huge 3+ ft diameter branching beginning at the height of 75 feet up! That's where old-growth greatness beacons.

During the early to mid 20th century, American chestnut trees were devastated by chestnut blight, a fungal disease that came from Chinese chestnut trees that were introduced into North America from East Asia. It is estimated that the blight killed between 3 and 4 billion American chestnut trees in the first half of the 20th century, beginning in 1904. Very few mature specimens of the tree exist within its historical range, although many small shoots of the former live trees remain.


The blight was first found in the chestnut trees on the grounds of the New York Zoological Garden (the "Bronx Zoo") by Herman W. Merkel, a forester at the zoo. In 1905, Murrill isolated and described the fungus responsible (which he named Diaporthe parasitica), and demonstrated by inoculation into healthy plants that the fungus caused the disease. By 1940, most mature American chestnut trees had been wiped out by the disease.

The reddish-brown wood of the American chestnut was lightweight, soft, easy to split, very resistant to decay, and did not warp or shrink. For three centuries many barns and homes near the Appalachian Mountains were made from American chestnut. Its straight-grained wood was ideal for building furniture and caskets. The fruit that fell to the ground was an important cash crop and food source. The bark and wood were rich in tannic acid, which provided tannins for use in the tanning of leather. Many native animals fed on chestnuts, and chestnuts were used for livestock feed, which kept the cost of raising livestock low.

Efforts started in the 1930s and are still ongoing, to repopulate the country with chestnut trees. Wikipedia



Stained Glass has been around and admired for centuries. The first stained glass panel dates back to the 600's and was quite simple. It was first used as a teaching tool in churches where stained glass panels were created to depict stories from the Bible. Since many people could not read, the beautiful colored glass scenes explained the different verses. Over time when creation of this art became more affordable, it was incorporated into the décor of residential dwellings. In the 1800's New York City became a mecca for glass construction. The colors were superb, colored all the way through and executed by artisans that rivaled the best in Europe.

The various vibrant colors were made from distinct minerals and silica and sand to achieve the perfect color, like chromium, silver, gold and cobalt. Creation followed basic steps starting with blowing the glass into cylinders, allowing it to dry, (think a big balloon) then flattening and cutting for the project. Most hand-blown glass has thick and thin depths. Being ballooned and flattened causes these inconsistencies.






It is often thought that this fascinating glass can fade with time; it does not.

At times stained glass windows may appear to be melting with the sun. This material does not melt. Afterall, it is fired in a kiln reaching over 1500 degrees. The sun cannot melt it. If there are bends in the windows it sometimes comes from the lead channels stretching over time. Panels made by the lead channel method need to be re-leaded about every 100 years.

The process of making stained glass leaded windows has about 8 steps, First you would fashion the design with attention to all details. The second step is to make the full size cartoon proportionate to the size of the window. You use special 3 bladed scissors to cut the cartoon. Then your pattern stays true to size and does not grow allowing for the thickness of the lead channel. Next is the fun part, glass cutting. A glue stick is used to attach the paper pattern to the glass. Then, using a *glass cutter* you score the glass and break it with pliers with some colors easier to

cut than others. Beware of white glass as it is very brittle.

If you are painting the glass with enamels you would then fire in a kiln to make the paint permanent. Next, grind or groze the edges of the glass to make it smooth and to help pieces fit better. Next, assemble the panel using a *H lead came* so that the glass can fit on both sides of the lead. After soldering the joints the panel would be framed in zinc. You would then putty or cement the entire panel, cleaning it and also making it weatherproof. The last step would be to install the panel on the inside in front of an existing window. This helps protect the window from the weather, and makes your window last a long time. Knowing the number of steps and skill described, you can better appreciate the skill and experience a glass artist must develop.



There is also an alternate way to create stained glass that was invented by Tiffany and La Farge. Copper foil was attached to the edges of the glass using wax. Then the each piece of glass was soldered together. Today most lamps and contemporary smaller windows are made using this technique.

My stained glass journey started as a hobby in high school. Over the years I continued to make lamps, panels boxes and suncatchers. I earned a Bachelor of Fine arts at Mount St. Mary's University in Maryland before working in retail for over 11 years. I was then ready for a change, managing a stained glass store for 3 years. Two other women (employees) and myself bought the store. I owned the store for 26 years and finally decided to retire in August 2020. During my career, I have

done everything that can be done with glass. Mosaics, lamp work beads, fusing, lead work and copper foil. I have also taught hundreds of people passing this artisan knowledge onto them. I especially enjoy combining glass fusing and copper foil as can be seen in much of my work. I cut the glass pieces and glue to glass, then fire in a kiln. After firing I cut a glass border to surround the fused center piece. I also do repairs, custom pieces and several craft shows each year, and exhibit year-round at Artisans United Gallery at the Packard Center in Annandale where like-minded artists can meet members of the community. The Gallery displays and sells a variety of pieces, including jewelry, pottery, stained glass, wooden toys and wooden jewelry boxes, photographs, needle crafts, and more. Stop by and see the light!

The Craft Gallery of Artisans United is a cooperative endeavor, staffed and run by the independent members of Artisans United, Inc. as well as those individuals belonging to the member Guilds. On a daily basis, visitors will find the Gallery artisans happy to explain crafting techniques and to share their knowledge of where craft materials may be obtained. And, too, visitors will often discover impromptu demos in progress as the artists complete their creations. We are always looking for new craftspeople to join our organization. 



This toleware pie pan with fluted edges is decorated with white flowers, green leaves and yellow wheat. Yellow and green lines were painted on the raised edges inside the pan, and small flecks of gold paint surround the center image. Toleware refers to objects made of tin that have been lacquered and adorned with a picture or design and comes from the French phrase "tôle peinte," which means "painted sheet metal."

This technique developed in the 18th century and spread across Europe and America. Sheets of iron or steel were dipped in molten tin or pewter to form a foundation that could be decorated with paint or varnish. The technique is said to have been developed to keep utilitarian household products from rusting. In America, toleware was initially imported from England and France because of a law that prevented tin from being produced in the colonies, but eventually tin craftsman in America, known as "whitesmiths," secured a reliable

source for tin and began creating their own pieces. Areas in Maine, Connecticut and Pennsylvania Dutch country became known for the craft.

These pieces of painted metal are usually associated with folk arts and crafts but can feature refined and intricately painted designs. Though the Revolutionary War created a gap in production, toleware continued to flourish until the

end of the 19th century and even saw a brief resurgence in America in the 1950s.

The Park Authority's toleware pieces come from our Lahey Collection. In 1940, Richard Lahey, the once principal emeritus of the Corcoran School of Art and a well-respected artist and teacher, and his wife, Carlotta Gonzales Lahey, a painter, sculptor and teacher, bought 45 acres of land in Vienna. Richard and Carlotta were important members of their community who truly loved art and Fairfax County. Throughout their lives, they collected interesting historic furniture, folk art and antiques. Carlotta bequeathed 22 acres of land, their house, and its contents to the Fairfax County Park Authority in memory of Richard. Their beautiful home is now part of the Fairfax County Park Authority's Resident Curator Program.

The term tôle, derived from the French tôle peinte, "painted sheet metal", is synonymous in English usage with japanning on tin, such as the tôle shades for bouilotte lamps and other candle shades, and trays and lidded canisters, in which stenciling and gilding often features, almost always on a black ground. Pontypool and Usk in South Wales made a reputation for tôle imitating Japanese lacquer starting in the early 19th century.

In American collectibles and antiques, toleware refers to kitchenrelated objects created from metal, typically tin or thin steel, and are often in decorative styles such as Arts and Crafts and Pennsylvania Dutch. Decorative painting on these items is common but not necessary. This style of decorative art spread from Europe to the United States in the 18th century, and was popular in US kitchens in the 18th and 19th centuries.

In the field of handicrafts, tole painting on metal objects is a popular amateur pastime. (Wikipedia)



Home Security Reminders Ahead of Vacation Season Road Shark Campaign



The Fairfax County Police Department needs your help in preventing burglaries. Home security starts with you.

Officers from our Crime Prevention Unit have identified some simple tips that can help strengthen the security of your property and deter crime.

- Install security cameras that preferably have recording capabilities.
- If you're heading out of town, avoid announcing your plans on social media.

• Ensure your residence appears occupied, even when no one is home, by using timers on lights.

- Keep all doors and windows closed and locked.
- Secure sliding glass doors by placing a metal rod or a wooden dowel rod in the track.
- Lock the door to an attached garage.
- Keep the perimeter of your home well-lit.
- Have a trusted neighbor check on your home if you plan to be away.
- Keep landscaping trimmed near entrances and walkways.
- Organize or join a Neighborhood Watch program.
- Keep an inventory of your property.
- Store ladders, tools, and any other outside objects in a locked shed or garage.
- Set a reminder every night before bed to lock your car and home to keep them safe.
- Report suspicious activity to our non-emergency number at (703) 691-2131. If you have an emergency, use 911.

Protect Your Pet During an Emergency

Plan in Advance & Pack an Emergency Kit



PET PREPAREDNESS: DISASTER KIT CHECKLIST

Pet owners are reminded to always prepare emergency plans for their animal companions so that they can weather emergency conditions safely. Pets, like humans, are victims of natural and man-made disasters, so owners must be prepared to evacuate their pets with the necessary supplies.

Key Takeaways

- Pets need to be included in the family's emergency plan.
- Two emergency kits are necessary for pets: one for sheltering in place and one for evacuation.
- Make sure your pet has a collar with tag containing all updated information.
- If not already done, have your pet microchipped.

Disasters can strike at any moment. It's crucial to be fully prepared to evacuate with your pets in case of an emergency.

Emergency Planning for Pets

Emergency planning for pets is a crucial aspect of disaster preparedness, and it involves taking necessary measures to ensure pet safety during emergencies. Pet owners should develop an emergency plan, build an emergency kit and seek advice from our the county's Emergency Management and Security Department at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/emergencymanagement/ to prepare their pets for disasters. An evacuation plan is also important to ensure pets are not left behind during an emergency evacuation.

Emergency Kits for Pets

The emergency kit for pets should be regularly reviewed and updated with fresh food water for at least one week along with feeding bowls and medication stored in waterproof containers. Additionally, the kit should contain a traveling bag, crate, or sturdy carrier for each pet, which should be large enough for the pet to stand up, turn around and lie down comfortably.

Pack a familiar bed or blanket, litter box, litter, litter scoop for cats and dog leashes, collars, dog tags, poop bags for dogs along with a photo of you with your pet. Good idea to make a photocopy of vaccination/veterinary records and your pet's contact info. Whenever you take your pet in for their annual check-up, ask the vet to photocopy the pet's records and sequester immediately in your emergency kit so you need not go in a frantic search during an evacuation.

Identification and contact information should be updated and included in the kit. Grooming items and sanitation needs, such as litter boxes, waste bags and cleaning supplies, should also be included. Familiar items, such as toys and blankets, can help reduce stress for pets (and family members too) during a disaster.




