A Guide to the Top Spring Cleanup Tasks to Enhance Your Landscape

Spring is here, and now is the time to think about cleaning up and giving your landscape a fresh look. Leave the doldrums of winter and get ready for the warmer spring months.

Cleaning up Debris and Weeding Your Flowerbeds

Mother Nature leaves a mess during the wintertime. Your landscape may have leaves, pinecones, nuts, seed pods, trash, and other debris lying on your property after windy winter weather.

Your landscape plants will be able to wake up



to springtime when all of the debris and trash is cleaned up.

First, remove plant debris, then pull up last year's annuals, and finally add fertilizer to plants as needed.

Now that the weeds have been removed from the garden surface and before new weed germination, we recommend applying Preen Pre-Emergent Granules [®] for weed prevention. Early spring application will prevent the growth of summer weeds; however, it will not kill existing weeds. For the best success, it should be applied every 9-

Pruning Your Trees and Shrubs

12 weeks during the growing season.

Plus, the cold temperatures help control the sap and trees recover quickly from pruning wounds.

Using the correct tool(s), our landscapers selectively trim the following from your trees and shrubs to give them a uniform look while preserving their natural shape:

- Damaged, dead, decaying, or weak branches
- Removing lower tree branches that create a visual obstruction
- Structural pruning on young trees
- Tree suckers and sprouts emerging from the tree
- Thinning or reducing the tree's density to allow more air circulation and sunlight into the crown.

Edging Your Landscape

Since most woody plants begin new growth early in the spring, fertilizer helps:

- Stimulate new growth
- Roots go deep in the ground to find water sources during drought
- Ensure your trees and shrubs are healthy and can fight off pests and diseases
- Mulching for a Tidy Look and Other Plant Health Benefits

Mulch does more than make your flowerbeds and landscaped areas look tidy. Indeed, mulch provides many benefits to plants, trees, and shrubs:

- Prevents frost heave
- Regulates soil temperatures
- Insulates plant roots to keep them cool in the summer and warm in the winter
- Holds in moisture
- Reduces weeds
- Adds nutrients as it breaks down.

Our landscape designers recommend natural mulch because it'll provide more nutrition as it breaks down in the soil. Three recommended mulches are hardwood chips or bark, hardwood shredded and Pine straw and pine needles. Don't go overboard with the mulch as it is important for water to still penetrate to the plant roots as well as air needs to circulate.

Adding Seasonal Color to Beautify Your Spring Landscape

Make your landscape pop with color. Adding seasonal color provides interest to the landscape. Our landscape designers/horticulturists listen to understand and deliver your landscape vision. Plants will be recommended that will thrive in the specific landscape conditions. Every landscape is unique and choosing the correct plants in your landscape design is critical for success.

Below are a few colorful flowering plants that our horticulturists recommend for your property:

Serviceberry trees (*Amelanchier arborea/A. canadensis*) for year-round interest, starting in spring with white blossoms, yellow to red leaves in the fall, and smooth gray bark and purple fruit in the winter.

Pinxterbloom azaleas (*Rhododendron periclymenoides – Pinxterbloom Azalea*) work well in shady landscapes and areas with moist, well-drained soil. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love this flowering shrub's pink blooms.

Flowering perennials include:

Moss phlox (*Phlox subulata*) – This beautiful groundcover has rose, pink, or white flowers that bloom from April through May. The leaves mimic the look of moss.

Creeping phlox (*Phlox stolonifera*) – Another beautiful groundcover blooms in various colors between March and April. This groundcover does well in rock gardens and retaining walls.

Eastern columbine (*Aquilegia canadensis*) – This perennial has showy red, pink, and yellow bell-like blooms and grows in bunches. Eastern Columbine does well in shaded areas, blooming from April through May.

Virginia bluebells (*Mertensia virginiana*) – Virginia bluebells' unique blue set in dark purplish-green foliage creates a magical picture along your property's wetlands or in your wooded land-scape. Truly awe-inspiring.

Common annuals to brighten borders, walkways, and retaining walls – Traditional annuals, including begonias, geraniums, impatiens, and petunias, keep flowering from spring through fall and work well in baskets, garden beds, and with hardscapes.

Does a Corporation Need Business Insurance?

You may have heard that corporations protect you from business liability. But does that mean you don't need insurance? Not if you don't want to lose your business. A corporation may protect you from personal liability, but the corporation itself can still be sued.

Why Do Lawyers Say a Corporation Can Protect You from Liability?

A corporation protects you from personal liability for business debts. What this means is that if someone sues your corporation or if your corporation can't pay back a loan, the plaintiff or creditor can only take what's inside of the corporation. They can't take

your house, your retirement savings, or any other personal property.

Your corporation can still be sued, and you may still need to go

to court to defend it. If your corporation loses, you may have to pay the judgment by using the savings in your business bank account, selling business assets, or giving up real property owned by the corporation. If there is nothing left or you don't have enough cash to continue operations, you may have to go out of business.

Can't You Just Make a New Corporation?

It may be possible to close your original corporation and start over under a new name, but doing this isn't easy. The law is designed so that you repay your debts whenever possible. A judge may decide to pierce the corporate veil and say that your actions weren't really under the original corporation and enter a judgment against either you personally or your new business. If you try to transfer assets to a new corporation — anything from tools to intangible assets like goodwill — a judge may decide it's a continuation of the original business and enforce a judgment against its future income. In short, you shouldn't view operating under a corporation as a get-out-of-jail-free card.

How Does Business Insurance Protect a Corporation? Business insurance works similarly to personal insurance, except

it pays on behalf of the corporation instead of an individual. If someone is injured at your business or your employee covers property damage, your business insurance company will handle the resulting claim. Just like with personal insurance, you can, and probably want to, purchase different types of coverage such as commercial auto insurance, general liability insurance, property insurance, and workers' compensation coverage. This will keep any claims against your business from slowing your operations or even putting you out of business.

#2, have your Dryer Ductwork professionally cleaned. Again, save on efficiency and repair costs

#3,.check the drainage away from your downspouts to prevent flooding; have your gutters and downspouts cleaned. Take a walk around the outside of your house while it is raining.

Let Us Prey

Mother Nature must have been very fond of insects when creating Virginia because there are more than 20,000 species of bugs and bug-like creatures living across the Old Dominion. And of all of those, about 10 percent or 2,100 species are deemed beneficial bugs. And in my book, the king of the beneficial insects is the praying mantis.

The Praying mantis is a strong, patient hunter. It can wait motionless for long periods of time until a clueless victim wanders within reach. And within reach is the name of the mantis game. Careful observation reveals that the mantis lies in wait until it can reach out and imperceptibly touch its prey with both of its long, super-thin antennae; the *moment* it touches with both, the mantis quick-as-lightning strikes to grasp its prey in both spiked forearms. Once in hold, the otherworldly mantis mechanically devours its prey with its strong jaws. To us, they are harmless, do not sting, and have no venom.

The completely carnivorous mantis is the ultimate patient predator with its camouflage appearance and sole, unique ability to swivel its head at extreme angles while using its excellent binocular vison to hone in on victims. Adding to its invincibility is a defensive hearing adaptation in the middle of its thorax. This auditory organ evolved to detect bat echolocation waves, its main predator, enables flying mantises to respond evasively. So, when you see a mantis on a night flight suddenly dive downward, he's proactively avoiding an incoming bat like a fighter pilot.

Mantises are infamous for their cannibalism, especially the female's habit of decapitating her much smaller suitor after (or even <u>before</u>) mating, and then entirely consuming him after-

wards. I've seen a large female mantis completely consume two males within her reach in a matter of five minutes!

Praying mantises' enormous appetites, tendency to stay put/ not wander, and highly effective hunting methods make them a recognized Earth-friendly alternative to chemical insecticides. You name, it, they will eat just about any insect, from grasshoppers and beetles to caterpillars, flies, and other large and small insect pests. As such, their egg masses are sold at some garden stores for seeding gardens with these beneficial hunters. Given their cannibalistic ways, they also control their own numbers.

There are three species of mantises in Virginia – the Chinese, European, and Carolina mantises. The European and Chinese are larger (4 to 5 inches long) and considered invasive and less desired species because they're not native and eat beneficial insects like butterflies and bees. You can easily identify the Carolina mantis because it is three inches in length and can range in color from green to dusky brown to grey.


I've always been fascinated by praying mantises being the ultimate predator with such excellent vision. I always remember how a large female I kept as a pet in an aquarium would cock its head at me from across the room when I would get up from my chair. Let's just be glad they are not six feet long.

Top Ten Home Security Tips

Fairfax County Police Department



Our homes are our safe havens, and FCPD is ensuring that our community members are equipped with the necessary information and tools to protect this space for ourselves and loved ones. Home burglaries can be a distressing experience, but with some precautionary measures, you can significantly reduce the risk.

1. Secure Entry Points

Strong Doors and Windows: Ensure all exterior doors are made of solid materials and equipped with sturdy deadbolt locks. Reinforce windows with laminated glass or install security film to make them more resistant to break-ins.

Quality Locks: Invest in high-quality locks for doors and windows. Deadbolt locks with at least a one-inch throw are recommended for exterior doors.

Sliding Doors: Place a metal rod or a dowel (Charley bar) in the track of sliding glass doors to prevent them from being forced open.

2. Adequate Lighting

Exterior Lighting: Install motion-activated lights around the perimeter of your home, especially near entry points. A well-lit property serves as a deterrent to potential burglars.

Timers: Use timers for interior lights, radios, or TVs to give the appearance that someone is home, even when you're away.

3. Landscaping



EARLY BASEBALL IN ANNANDALE

The Annandale Dreadnaughts & the Beginning of the Annandale Little League



The Annandale Dreadnaughts, founded in 1940, played teams from around the Northern Virginia region, attracting a loyal crowd of fans. When hosting a game in Annandale, fans brought blankets and folding chairs along with picnic gear for a full afternoon of entertainment. A field was established off Daniels Ave. close to the site of what would become the school & Little League field behind the Annandale Elementary School. The team would "pass the hat" after each game to help

pay for uniforms and equipment. Many of these players went onto coach Annandale Little League Teams when the Annandale Little League was formed in the mid 1950's.

In the late 1950's Annandale formed a Little League bringing the National sport and enjoyment to the boys and families in our community. Much later, it joined with neighboring teams to form the Mason District Little League which brings today the

same spirit of teamwork, comradeship and sportsmanship to the next generation while providing them with a formative athletic experience.

How did the Annandale Little League start? First a trip to Williamsport, PA to consult with the National Little League including a lengthy seminar about starting a Little League. Back in Annandale, a committee was formed including many former Dreadnaught players. A few fields were available but more would be necessary to form a larger league. Fundraising ensued to purchase bases, balls, bats and umpire equipment. More funds were eventually raised to build dugouts and backstops, but for the early days, a few parents would drag along their picnic benches.
